

Pumpkin Memories Pillow (Brown Colourway)

Autumn has many occasions to celebrate and this pumpkin pillow would be ideal to add a decorative touch to your parties, especially if you also make its companion pillow and the Pumpkin Memories Quilt. The Creating Memories Autumn, Thanksgiving and Halloween collection of fabrics is warm and welcoming, so is suitable for many projects. This pillow has a toasty brown Chambray background, while the other pillow uses a spicy ginger Chambray. See page 9.

Fabric Notes

The Chambray fabrics can be cut in any direction for the most economical use of the fabric. The exact sizes needed for Fabrics 6 to 21 are given in the Materials list.

General Notes

- Fabric quantities are based on a usable width of 42in (107cm), unless otherwise stated.
- Measurements are in imperial inches with metric conversions in brackets use only *one* system throughout (preferably inches). Width measurements are generally given first.
- Press fabric before cutting and trim as needed to square up the fabric pattern/weave, using a quilting ruler to cut the top raw edge at 90 degrees to the selvedges.
- Use ¹/₄in (6mm) seams unless otherwise instructed.
- Read all the instructions through before you start.
- Always make one complete block as a test before going on to make the remaining blocks.

Pillow Layout

1 The pillow has five whole Pumpkin blocks and two partial blocks, used to create an edge-to-edge design. The blocks have four different colourways. Pieces of background fabric are used as filler pieces, plus a border on each side. See **Fig A** for the fabrics used and **Fig B** for the pillow layout.

Cutting Out

2 From Fabric 1 cut the filler and side border pieces first, cutting the following pieces (the sizes are also shown in **Fig B**).

- Filler A two 8¹/₂in x 1in (21.6cm x 2.5cm).
- Filler B four 8¹/₂in x 1³/₄in (21.6cm x 4.4cm).
- Filler C two 8¹/₂in x 2in (21.6cm x 5.1cm).
- Side borders two strips $17\frac{1}{4}$ in x $1\frac{1}{2}$ in (43.8cm x 3.8cm).

3 For the Fabric 1 background pieces for the blocks, follow the cut measurements given in **Fig C**, noting that there are some differences in measurements between the whole and partial blocks.

- For the Whole Pumpkins cut pieces **a**, **d** and **f**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (top) cut pieces **a**, **d** and **f**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (bottom) cut pieces **b**.

4 For the print and Chambray fabrics, follow the cut measurements shown in **Fig C**. The exact sizes needed for Fabrics 6 to 21 are given in the Materials list. Refer to **Fig D** for the exact fabric positions in the blocks.

- For the Whole Pumpkins cut pieces **b**, **c** and **e**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (top) cut pieces **b**, **c** and **e**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (bottom) cut pieces **a**.

5 Cut the fabric for the back of the pillow into two pieces 27¹/₂in x 12in (69.8cm x 30.5cm).

6 Cut the binding fabric into three $2\frac{1}{2}$ in (6.4cm) x width of fabric strips. Sew the strips together end to end and press seams open. Press the binding in half along the length, wrong sides together.

Making the Blocks

7 Apart from the block assembly, the piecing required is to create corner triangle units. The basic technique is the same regardless of the size of the pieces being sewn. **Fig E** shows the stages, with the basic process as follows. Place the larger piece of fabric right side up (RS). Take the small square and pencil mark a diagonal line on the wrong side (WS) of the square. Pin the square right sides together with the larger fabric piece, aligning the edges, as shown, and with the diagonal line in the direction needed. Sew along the marked line. Trim off excess fabric ¹/₄in (6mm) outside the sewn line and gently press the triangle outwards. Check the unit is the same size as the original larger piece of fabric, with no distortion.

8 When the pieced units have been made, a block can be sewn together. Follow the stages in **Fig F**, pressing seams after each stage, pressing open or to one side. Note that in **Fig F 2**, four corner triangles need to be created on the body of the pumpkin, so use the same process as previously described. When the assembly is finished, check the sewn block is $8\frac{1}{2}$ in x $7\frac{1}{4}$ in (21.6cm x 18.4cm). Repeat this block-making process to make one more Block 1. Repeat the process to make two of Block 2 and one of Block 4.

9 To make the partial blocks, use the same methods as before following **Fig D** for the colours and layout. Make one of partial Block 3 (top) and one of partial Block 3 (bottom). Once made, check the blocks are the sizes they should be – for Partial Pumpkin (top) this should be $8\frac{1}{2}$ in x $4\frac{3}{4}$ in (21.6cm x 12cm) and for Partial Pumpkin (bottom) $8\frac{1}{2}$ in x $3\frac{3}{4}$ in (21.6cm x 9.5cm).

Assembling the Pillow

10 Follow Fig G to sew the pillow patchwork together in columns first, placing the filler pieces in the correct positions. The block positions are identified by their number in the diagram, so follow this. Press the seams in one direction. Now sew the columns together, pressing seams to one side. Add the side border strips as shown, pressing the seams towards the border strips.

Quilting and Finishing

11 Make a quilt sandwich of the patchwork, wadding (batting) and lining fabric (if using). Quilt as desired. Trim off excess wadding and lining fabric to match the patchwork size.

12 To make up the pillow cover, take the two pieces of fabric for the cushion back and on one long edge of each piece, create a hem by turning the edge over by 1in (2.5cm), twice. Sew the seams with matching thread and press (Fig H). The diagram is shown in greys, so you can use the Tilda fabric and buttons suggested in the Materials list, or those of your choice.

13 For the fastening, using your sewing machine, create five equally spaced buttonholes within the hem of one of the pieces. Sew five buttons onto the other piece, matching their positions to the buttonholes. Note: Instead of making buttonholes, you could use a hook and loop fastening, such as Velcro, to fasten the cover and sew on the buttons as a decorative feature.

14 The pillow has a bound edge, so the pieces are assembled with right sides out, as follows. On the backing, fasten the buttons into the buttonholes and place the whole piece right side down. Place the quilted patchwork on top, right side up. Make sure the outer edges of all pieces are aligned. Pin or tack (baste) the layers together and then bind as normal. As you sew the binding in place it will fix the other layers together. Press the cover and insert a pillow pad to finish.

Pumpkin Memories Pillow (Ginger Colourway)

When the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness arrives, celebrate it with a pair of cosy pillows in welcoming autumnal shades. Two pillow designs use the pumpkin motif from the Pumpkin Memories Quilt, showcasing the warm prints from the Creating Memories Autumn, Thanksgiving and Halloween collection. Pillow Layout

1 The pillow has five whole Pumpkin blocks and two partial blocks, used to create an edge-to-edge design. The blocks have four different colourways. Pieces of background fabric are used as filler pieces, plus a border on each side. See **Fig A** for the fabrics used and **Fig B** for the pillow layout.

Cutting Out

2 From Fabric 1 cut the filler and side border pieces first, cutting the following pieces (the sizes are also shown in **Fig B**).

- Filler A two 8¹/₂in x 1in (21.6cm x 2.5cm).
- Filler B four 8¹/₂in x 1³/₄in (21.6cm x 4.4cm).
- Filler C two 8¹/₂in x 2in (21.6cm x 5.1cm).
- Side borders two strips 17¹/₄in x 1¹/₂in (43.8cm x 3.8cm).

3 For the Fabric 1 background pieces for the blocks, follow the cut measurements given in **Fig C**, noting that there are some differences in measurements between the whole and partial blocks.

- For the Whole Pumpkins cut pieces **a**, **d** and **f**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (top) cut pieces **a**, **d** and **f**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (bottom) cut pieces **b**.

4 For the print and Chambray fabrics, follow the cut measurements shown in **Fig C**. The exact sizes needed for Fabrics 6 to 21 are given in the Materials list. Refer to **Fig D** for the exact fabric positions in the blocks.

- For the Whole Pumpkins cut pieces **b**, **c** and **e**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (top) cut pieces **b**, **c** and **e**.
- For the Partial Pumpkins (bottom) cut pieces **a**.

5 Cut the fabric for the back of the pillow into two pieces 27¹/₂in x 12in (69.8cm x 30.5cm).

6 Cut the binding fabric into three $2\frac{1}{2}$ in (6.4cm) x width of fabric strips. Sew the strips together end to end and press seams open. Press the binding in half along the length, wrong sides together.

Making the Blocks

7 Apart from the block assembly, the piecing required is to create corner triangle units. The basic technique is the same regardless of the size of the pieces being sewn. **Fig E** shows the stages, with the basic process as follows. Place the larger piece of fabric right side up (RS). Take the small square and pencil mark a diagonal line on the wrong side (WS) of the square. Pin the square right sides together with the larger fabric piece, aligning the edges, as shown, and with the diagonal line in the direction needed. Sew along the marked line. Trim off excess fabric ¹/₄in (6mm) outside the sewn line and gently press the triangle outwards. Check the unit is the same size as the original larger piece of fabric, with no distortion.

8 When the pieced units have been made, a block can be sewn together. Follow the stages in **Fig F**, pressing seams after each stage, pressing open or to one side. Note that in **Fig F 2**, four corner triangles need to be created on the body of the pumpkin, so use the same process as previously described. When the assembly is finished, check the sewn block is 8½in x 7¼in (21.6cm x 18.4cm). Repeat this block-making process to make one more Block 1. Repeat the process to make two of Block 2 and one of Block 4.





9 To make the partial blocks, use the same methods as before following **Fig D** for the colours and layout. Make one of partial Block 3 (top) and one of partial Block 3 (bottom). Once made, check the blocks are the sizes they should be – for Partial Pumpkin (top) this should be $8\frac{1}{2}$ in x $4\frac{3}{4}$ in (21.6cm x 12cm) and for Partial Pumpkin (bottom) $8\frac{1}{2}$ in x $3\frac{3}{4}$ in (21.6cm x 9.5cm).

Assembling the Pillow

10 Follow Fig G to sew the pillow patchwork together in columns first, placing the filler pieces in the correct positions. The block positions are identified by their number in the diagram, so follow this. Press the seams in one direction. Now sew the columns together, pressing seams to one side.
